






A person who studies linguistics is usualy referred to a linguist.


Linguists in the sense of linguistics experts need not be fluent in anguages though they must have a wide experience of different types of languages (Aitchison, 1999)




- Linguistics differs from traditional school of grammar is that linguists regard the spoken language as primary not written.
- * Linguistics does not force languages into latin —based framework.

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



FIGURE OF THE SCOPE OF
