THE SYLLABLE IN ENGLISH PRONUNCIATION



How can define the Syllable:

IN GENERAL: The syllable is auntie of pronunciation having the vowel with or without surroundings consonant.

Ex / I/ai/. He/hi/. Is/is/

Phonetically speaking: The syllable are usually described as consisting of a center which has little or no **Distruction** to air flow and which sound comparatively loud.

Phonologically speaking: the syllable can be vowels and consorants having different Distribution.

WHAT ARE THE TYPES OF SYLLABLE:

Minimum syllable: is a syllable consisting of one single vowel in isolation.

```
Ex: "are" /a:/ "err" /3:/ *
```

Some syllable have an ONSET (is that the consonant which comes initially)

Ex: He /hi:/ Ki /ki:/ She /si:/ ❖

Some syllable have a <u>CODA</u> (is that consonant which comes finally).

Ex: is/Iz/ ease /i:z/\$

Some syllable have both Onest and Coda . *

Ex: sit/sit/ fill/fil/ �



MORE INFORMATIONAL OF ONSET:

The structure of English Syllable

- Onset :
 - a word may begin with a vowel. Any vowel except /o / (zero onset).
 - -It may begin with one consonant. Any consonant except / ŋ / and /ʒ/.
- It may begin with two or more phonemes together. They are called consonant clusters.

Examples

 Some syllables have no onset but they have coda: am /æm / ought / o:t / ease /i:z /

CONSONANT CLUSTER:

Consonant cluster (sequence): When we have two or more consonant together.

English syllable phonological structure:

- The English syllable has this phonological structure:
- Pre initial + initial + post initial +VOWEL + pre-final + final + post final 1 + post final 2 + post final 3
- Recently the vowel and coda are known as rhyme.
- The rhyme is divided into peak and coda.

Initial Consonant Clusters

Initial two consonant clusters are of 2 types

- -/ s/ followed by /t/ /m/ /w/ /j/
- One of 15 consonants followed by /l/ /r/ /w/ /j/ try quick few play

Final consonant clusters:

It may end with two consonants:

- final consonant preceded by pre final consonant /m/ /n/ /l/ /s/ /ŋ /


